17 Hamotzi S: 754, C: 228

Bread, made from wheat, is the staple diet for many people in the world. To recognise the importance of bread as a life giving force we make this blessing before eating it.

Birkat Hamazon – Grace after meals

The Torah commands: 'when you have eaten and are satisfied, you shall bless the L-rd'. Birkat Hamazon is the blessing we say after eating bread to thank God for the meal we have eaten. On Shabbat and festivals there are some additional insertions that are not included in this recording.

39 Mizmor l'David (PSALM 29) S: 264

This psalm describes how God is awesome and powerful but nevertheless has a personal and loving relationship with the Jewish people. Reciting it on Shabbat reminds us that this is the case even at very difficult times.

40 L'cha Dodi S: 266-270, C: 112-114 L'cha Dodi is a beautiful Shabbat song about the meaning of Shabbat, the wonder of Jerusalem, the Jewish people and the Moshiach.

41 Mizmor Shir I'yom Ha-Shabbat (PSALM 92) S: 270

The Rabbis say that this is a song that speaks of one day in the future when there will be peace in the world and every day will be like one long Shabbat.

42 Tzadik Katamar (LAST TWO VERSES OF PSALM 92) S: 272 When every day will be like one long Shabbat there will be many good people. Good people are like tall trees that appear young and bare fruit even when they are old.

43 Mikolot Mayim (LAST TWO VERSES OF PSALM 93) S: 272 God is stronger than the waves of the sea. God and His laws will last for ever as is the commandment to honour the Shabbat.

At the conclusion of Shabbat

51 Havdala S: 608-610, C: 204

lavdala is said at the end of Shabbat to indicate that Shabbat has ended and the week has begun. The opening paragraph of Havdala speaks about the differences between the sacred and the ordinary, between light and dark and between Shabbat and the regular days of the week. We then make three blessings. The first one is over when the weak over sweet smelling spices to recall the sweet smell of Shabbat. The third blessing is for fire and light made over a lift Havdala candle to show that we can use lights and fire now that Shabbat is over. The concluding paragraph of Havdala ends with a blessing thanking God for distinguishing between the holy Shabbat and the weekdays.

Birkat Hashachar - Morning Blessings

The next 15 blessings are part of a group of blessings called 'Birkat Hashachar.' They are said every morning for the 'ordinary' things we do when we wake up.

People used to recite each of these blessings in conjunction with a particular action. In time they were collated as a group to be said together at the beginning of the morning service to ensure that none would be forgotten.

22 Hanoten Lasechvi Recited by Joseph Marks & Amber Craig

The first blessing thanks God for the rooster who crows to wake us up at daybreak. Thereby this reminds us that we have been given the ability to night and day, darkness and light, good and evil.

This prayer appears frequently throughout our synagogue services. We say it at the end of our personal Amida prayer and the various Kaddish prayers several times each day. It has also become a very popular universal song. uniting Jews from all different (take out different) corners of the globe.

Oseh shalom expresses the greatest Jewish dream and ambition – peace. We pray for peace at every level – within ourselves, to have peace in our homes, amongst our own nation, and of course for the whole world. There is nothing that brings this to life more than the voices of children singing for this vision to become a reality.

53 Kol Ha-Olam

This is a popular Israeli song because it gives people the courage to overcome life's challenges. In this song the whole world and life is compared to a very narrow bridge over which we must all pass. The important thing about our lives is that despite the many dangers that occur as we cross the bridge of life we must not be afraid.
